¹ **Homeland Security Concentration Courses (3 Courses, 9 Credits)**

These are the specialized "required" courses that define the emphasis. One or two additional general electives will be needed to complete elective requirements

² To graduate, students may choose one of three options: complete the **CRIJ 5346 Capstone** course, complete a thesis through the two graduate thesis courses **CRIJ 5390 and/or CRIJ 5391**, or pass a **Comprehensive Examination** covering all core and concentration coursework. Students who select the Comprehensive Examination option may then take an elective course to ensure they complete the required **30 total credit hours for graduation**.
