## **Concentration Overview**

120 semester hours minimum; 2.000 cumulative GPA minimum:

  - Earning a letter grade of C or better in ENGL 1301 Composition I and ENGL 1302 Composition II is strongly encouraged
  - SOCI 1301 Introduction to Sociology is preferred for the Social and Behavioral Sciences core requirement, and either MATH 1342 Elementary Statistical Methods or PSYC 2317 Introduction to Statistical Methods is preferred in the core component area
- · 36 hours within general electives block
  - ANTH 2351 Cultural Anthropology and COMM 1318 Interpersonal Communication are required courses for the general electives block
  - ANTH 2372 Ethnic Heritage and ENGL 2376 African-American Literature are preferred courses for the general electives block
- · 42 hours within advanced electives block
  - All courses applied to the advanced electives block must have a letter grade of C or better.
  - A minimum of 12 hours of senior (4000) level coursework is required within the advanced electives block.
