Concentration Overview

The Global Health concentration will allow students to examine a wide variety of health concerns, policies, and topics in relation to the global community. The knowledge and skills obtained through this program of study can be employed in various health industries including public health organizations, health care systems, and school and community health programs. Students interested in using this degree as a foundation for graduate school should consult their advisor(s) for methods to align coursework options for specific programs of advanced study.

Degree Requirements

120 semester hours minimum; 2.000 cumulative GPA minimum

- 42 hours within the general education core curriculum
 - Earning a letter grade of C or better in ENGL 1301 Composition I and ENGL 1302 Composition II is strongly encouraged
 - BIOL 2401 Anatomy and Physiology I & BIOL 2402 Anatomy and Physiology II, BIOL 1406 General Biology I (Majors) & BIOL 1407 General Biology II (Majors), or GEOL 1403 Geology I: Physical Geology & GEOL 1404 Geology II: Historical Geology are preferred for the Life and Physical Sciences core requirement; ENGL 2300 Close Reading II or PHIL 2306 Ethics is preferred for the Language, Philosophy, and Culture core requirement; and MATH 1342 Statistics or PSYC 2317 Introduction to Statistical Methods is preferred for the core component area
- 36 hours within general electives block
 - SOCI 1301 Introduction to Sociology, HLTH 1370 Health and Wellness, and HLTH 1373 Foundations of Public Health are required courses for the general electives block
 - HLTH 2374 Public and Consumer Health is a preferred course for the general electives block
- 42 hours within advanced electives block
 - All courses applied to the advanced electives block must have a letter grade of C or better.
 - A minimum of 12 hours of senior (4000) level coursework is required within the advanced electives block.
 - AASC 3301 Lifelong Learning and Portfolio Development, AASC 4301 Senior Seminar, and ENGL 3311 Professional Writing are required courses for the advanced electives block. Prerequisites for AASC 3301 Lifelong Learning and Portfolio Development include a letter grade of C or better in both ENGL 1301 Composition I and ENGL 1302 Composition II
 - Global Health Academic Area: 12 hours chosen from HLTH 3337 U.S. and International Health Disparities; HLTH 3360 Epidemiology; HLTH 4309 Environmental Hlth & GIS Apps; HLTH 4340 Public Health Program Planning; HLTH 4370
